EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS PLANNED FOR IMPLEMENTATION

The Michigan State University Athletic Training Program will initiate a new era in the Fall, 2000. Beginning in September, MSU will incorporate an undergraduate athletic training specialization educational program for its student athletic trainers. Under the direct supervision of clinical staff athletic trainers, students will have the opportunity to increase academic, classroom and clinical knowledge in athletic training. In the past, MSU's students have pursued NATA Certification underneath the Internship guidelines. The CAAHEP directed program will integrate a sequential learning environment, while the curriculum loads the



early semesters with degree and specialization required courses. Students will have the unique opportunity to reinforce their classroom experiences with hands-on clinical experiences directed by qualified clinical instructors. Dr. John Powell, Graduate
